6. *fremman* 'do' - *fremedest.*
7. *helpan* 'help' - *hilpst*
8. *bōc* 'book' N. sg. - *bēc*
9. *bycgan* 'buy' - *bohte*
10. *eald* 'old' - *ieldra*
11. *mann* 'man' - *menn*
12. *feoh* 'fee' - *fēo* nom.pl.
