General notes:

- Information about press optional (e.g., "Oxford: Oxford University Press 1980" or just: "Oxford 1980")
- No space between two-names abbreviations (e.g.: Cohen G.A.)
- Journal title in dual apostrophe (e.g. "Philosophia" 9(1980) no. 2)
- Abbreviations: ed. (editor), eds (editors), trans. (translation / translated by)
