Course Content

The proposed subject of Introduction to torts in civil code is to respond to the need for students to develop language competences in the field of law, in this case, civil law. As part of the course, students will be acquainted with the issues of torts in the Polish Civil Code, but also with regard to regulations and solutions used in common law. Thanks to this, they will have the opportunity to look at unlawful acts in a comparative context, and additionally acquire knowledge of basic concepts in this area of law. The students' independent work will concern an attempt to create a project aimed at developing a selected tort functioning in the Polish legal order in relation to the tort chosen by them in a state belonging to the common law system. This will allow students to familiarize themselves with the differences between civil and common law.
