I am a detective for the Santa Barbara Police department, and have been employed as a police officer by the City of Santa Barbara for the last 20 years, the last 10 of which I have been assigned to the robbery-homicide division of the police department.

On April 4, 2010 I personally spoke to a crime victim identified as Rose Zubeck. She told me that on April 3 she was working alone in her clothing store located at 302 State street In Santa Barbara. She sells second hand clothing at the store and she said she has been working in the clothing business for 20 years, all of it at this same store location. She related that on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of April she was running a vacuum cleaner at the store when she saw a man and a woman in the store. She said she shut off the vacuum cleaner and asked them if she could help them, and they both replied that they were just looking around. She resumed her vacuum work and moments later she told me that she saw and felt an arm go around her neck from behind and begin to choke her. She said that the arm was a black person as she could see the skin color and that the person was wearing a long sleeved white shirt which she could also see, but she could not see the persons face. She woke up the following day in a hospital bed at the Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital with severe head and face injured. When I spoke to her she was in the intensive care unit and was badly bruised in the area of her head and face and neck. She told me that before she was assaulted she did look at the man and the woman in the store and described them to me as follows: a large very fat white woman, blond hair, about 5 feet 6 inches tall and a tall thin black man wearing a white cowboy hat and a long sleeved white western style shirt with white embroidery on the front of the shirt. She said that she does not know if the man in the white shirt was the one who assaulted her as she did not see his face at the time of the assault, but that the clothing on the man she saw and the clothing on the sleeve of the black person who assaulted and choked her appeared to her to be similar. She said that the money from the store was all stolen, amounting to @ \$400 dollars.

On April 7, 2012 I was contacted by a Santa Barbara Police department patrol officer, 1 Steve Gonzalez. He told me the following: he said he had just come back form cottage 2 Hospital after following an ambulance there which resulted from a call he received 3 earlier while on duty. He as sent to the apartment of a woman identified as Mary Jones, 4 360 West Padre Street, Apartment 6, in Santa Barbara. Officer Gonzalez told me that 5 when he got there he spoke to Ms Jones, age 45, who told him that she lives next door 6 to a man named "Ritchie"- who lives in Apartment 5. She said she did not know 7 "Ritchie's" last name, but that he lived alone and that he drove gold Cadillac El Dorado. 8 She said she called the police as she has been hearing a terrible whining sound for the 9 last two days coming through the wall of the apartment from next door in Ritchie's 10 apartment, and thought that there was a dog trapped in the house. She said Ritchie's 11 12 car was not in the parking area of the apartment and she had not seen him for 3 days. Officer Gonzalez then told me that he could hear the same sound from both inside Ms 13 14 Jones apartment and from outside the front door of Apartment 5. He saw that the front door was open slightly- abut 2-3 inches. He knocked on the door and announced that 15 16 the police were there and to open the door and come out. No one responded. He than told me he asked the Santa Barbara Police dispatcher to call the apartment – and then 17 18 heard the phone ringing inside but no one answered. Officer Gonzalez then said he decided that he was going to enter the apartment and did so. In searching the 19 20 apartment he found a man, later identified as Richard Murphy lying on the floor between his bed and the wall separating the apartment from that of Ms Jones, and that Mr. 21 Murphy was unresponsive but alive. He called an ambulance and followed the 22 ambulance to cottage Hospital. He said he was unable to speak to Mr. Murphy as Mr. 23 Murphy was unresponsive to questioning and hospital personnel were working 24 25 feverishly on him to save his life.

Officer Gonzales then told me the above information as he knew that I was the detective assigned to the robbery and assault of Ms. Zubeck, and that there might be some connection since the injuries were similar. Officer Gonzales saw that Mr. Murphy was severely beaten about the head.

I went to cottage Hospital on April 8 and spoke to Dr Adam Brown, a neuro-surgeon who was one of the treating doctors for Mr. Murphy. He told me that Mr. Murphy was severely beaten or kicked in the head numerous times, causing a concussion and unconsciousness, and that he had been unconscious for a few days before being brought to the hospital. His life was no longer in danger but he was still unable to communicate verbally or otherwise.

While at the hospital I was contacted by the daughter of Mr. Murphy- who identified herself as Anne Wickham (her married name) Mrs. Wickham told me that her dad lived alone and that she had gone to the apartment but she could not get inside, as there were police seals on the door. I told her that the seals were placed there by myself after I served a search warrant for the apartment. She agreed to go back to her dad's apartment with me to examine it further. We did so that same day and she told me that her dad had an expensive collection of green jade items, all of people or animals and all between 6 and 12 inches tall on wooden brown bases. She was not sure how many he had but thought there were about 12 of them. I noticed a multi shelf glass case in the apartment and I could see dust rings where items were once on the shelf but were no longer there- I counted 15 spots where I believe items were recently removed. All of them were missing from the apartment. She also said her dad had gold Cadillac El Dorado and that it was no in the parking spot for the apartment. We both searched the apartment and could not find the car keys.

Mrs. Wickham told me that he dad lived alone but that he liked to drink, and often drank at neighborhood bars. With this information I asked Santa Barbara Police department volunteers to canvass the area near Ritchie's apartment with flyers asking for information on what happened. We started this on April 9<sup>th</sup>. The next day I received two telephone calls. One of them was a man who I went and personally met with- identified as Jake Stoddard. Mr. Stoddard, age 50- told me he knew Ritchie and saw him in a barrestaurant a few days before- he could not remember the exact date- and that he was with a very large and fat white woman and a tall black man who was wearing a long sleeved white shirt and a white cowboy hat. He said he did not know either of these

people. He said he had a drink and then left, but that the cook at the restaurant had planed to go with Ritchie and some other people e to have some more drinks. The cook

he identified as Eric Baker- and Mr. Baker had also called the police department in

The Identified de Elle Baker and Wil. Baker had also called the pelice department in

response to the information wanted flyer we distributed, so I had his number, and spoke

5 to him the same day.

He told me that he was drinking with Ritchie and Mr. Stoddard, and was also with a large very heavy white woman who had blond hair, and a tall thin black man who had on a cowboy hat- white in color. He said they met two "English girls" (his words) who went drinking with them- and that they went to the Santa Barbara Harbor to Mr. Stoddard's boat where the group continued to drink. He also described tha large white woman with blond hair and the tall thin black man, and added that the man had on a long sleeved white shirt and also remembered the white cowboy hat. He did not know the name of the two English girls, but in response to my asking him, said that the two

For the last two weeks I have been attempting to locate the two "English girls" but until today I was unsuccessful.

women from England were "taking lots of photos" and for sure they had a photo of the

black man and the large white woman, along with everyone else in the group.

On today's date I had made arrangements to return to Ritchie's apartment to give the keys back to his daughter. I arrived first and was sitting in the apartment when the phone rang. I answered it, and the woman on the other end of the line asked for "Ritchie." On further inquiry, because I immediately recognized the "English" accent, the woman told me that she and her friend were on a tour of California, had been in Santa Barbara some weeks ago and had met Ritchie and others on a boat, and now that they were on their way back to England they were once again passing through Santa Barbara from san Francisco and wanted to get together with Ritchie again. I made arrangements for the police patrol division to go to their hotel and bring them to the station. At the station both of the women, identified as Eunice Clarke and Alice Brent, told me that they were in fact on the boat with Ritchie and the others mentioned above, and gave me their camera and film. I had the pictures printed and immediately

distributed to all members of the police department. Within an hour I got a call from Adam Taylor, a Santa Barbara police Officer assigned to our juvenile bureau. He told me he recognized the photo of the large white woman with blond hair as a classmate of his from high school- giving me her name as SUSAN ANDREWS. I did a check with the department of Motor Vehicles and found a match for a SUSAN ANDREWS in the database, along with a DMV photo and her current address. I looked at the DMV photo and the photo of the large white woman from the boat- and am of the opinion that they are the same person. The DMV currently lists an address for SUSAN ANDREWS as 165 West Inglewood Place in Los Angeles County. I then ran a check on her driving record and found that she has received tickets while driving a 1998 Chevrolet pickup, yellow in color, bearing California plate T 569344.

I also conducted a search of the on line data base for Santa Barbara county and found that Tom and Susan Andrews were married in Santa Barbara on July 14, 2009

I ran a DMV check on Ritchie also and found the Cadillac El Dorado listed on the Search Warrant as being registered to him. The car has not been recovered as of this date and time.

I then ran the yellow pickup truck and found tickets in the name of TOM ANDREWS. I requested his DMV photo and identification information, and found that his height is listed at 6 feet, 1 inch tall and that his current DMV address is the same West Inglewood address listed above. I looked at the photo and believe that the same person on the "boat" photos showing a tall think black male with a white cowboy hat and a long sleeved white shirt are the same. In this connection I was told by Mr. Stoddard that when Ritchie left his boat he was very drunk, and that the tall black man and the large fat white woman were with him in Ritchie's car- with the black man driving the Cadillac as they left the harbor.

Earlier this afternoon I called the Los Angeles Police Department felony fugitive detail and spoke to Det. Sgt. Ivan Brooks. He drove the to the West Inglewood address listed

1	on the warrant and called me back, saying that the yellow pickup listed on the warrant
2	was parked in the driveway to the residence, and he also gave me the description of the
3	residence as I have described it on the warrant. He tried to look in to the garage but
4	could not get to a place where he could make the observation safely so he was unable
5	to tell me if the Cadillac was in the garage. Sgt. Brooks also told me that TOM
6	ANDREWS recently got a ticket (on May 3) for jaywalking near the Los Angeles Airport,
7	and listed his address as 165 West Inglewood Place.
8	
9	Based on the above information I believe that the clothing items and stolen jade will be
10	located in the residence or in the vehicle listed above, and that the Cadillac may also be
11	hidden in the garage. It has been my training and experience that persons who commit
12	the crime of theft will often keep the loot from the crimes at their place of residence or in
13	their vehicle.
14	I am also attaching two felony arrest warrants for the arrest of Tom and Susan Andrews
15	for robbery in violation of California Penal code Sec 211 (a)
