REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PAPERS

1. Volume: 20 000 characters including spaces, bibliography and summary (in Polish, English, Russian)
2. Characters:
 - a. basic text - Times New Roman 12 points;
 - b. foot-notes - Times New Roman 10;
3. Full text papers (format Rich Text Format (.rtf)) will be accepted only by electronic submission (email: rozumowskat@kul.lublin.pl);
4. All submitted articles should report original, previously unpublished research results, experimental or theoretical.
5. Reports which gets a positive notice will be publish as a book in the John Paul II Catholic University print.
