

LETTER FROM EDITORS

Dear Reader,

We are happy to present you volume XIX of the Review of Comparative Law. This issue contains a wide range of articles, whose topics cover both international and domestic issues.

The volume opens with two articles that discuss current problems of international importance from the human rights perspective and of international accountability. The first article by Baranowski concerns *ne bis in idem* under the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court as a corollary of the complementary jurisdiction of the Court. The following article by Kozak touches upon the importance of jurisprudence of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia in terms of crime against humanity. The texts by Matskevych, Shtefan and Nikolajew narrow their scope to some domestic issues of Ukraine and Iran: the first one is devoted to the study of the legal nature of the Internet mass media from the points of view of Ukrainian media laws and the copyright doctrine, the second one discusses one of the most controversial issues of the Ukrainian theory of civil procedural law, while the third article addresses various religious issues associated with some bodies of state authority and Iranian Constitution. The closing article by Witkowski focuses on some challenges connected with legal regulations concerning admission to the occupation of road transport operator in the European Union.

We hope that you will enjoy reading this volume.
