Course description:	<p>The aim of this course is to introduce students to basics of European Union Law regulations concerning EU institutions, legal instruments and legal nature of decisions. The basic method in the research work will be legal analysis of texts: the provisions of the Community Law, commentaries and literature issued by legal scholars and, first of all, studying the judgements delivered by the European Court of Justice. The Legal Development of European Integration, including the European Treaties, the European Communities and the European Union; Supranational Character of the European Integration; Character and Structure of European Union; Institutions: The European Council, Council of European Union, European Parliament, European Commission and other European Institutions; Community Legislation; Sources of Law of the European Union; The Nature and Application of EU Law; The Relationship Between EU Law and National Law; European Court of Justice and its Jurisdiction; Citizenship of the Union; Protection of Fundamental Rights in the European Union; Regulation of the Common Market: Free Movement of Persons, Goods, Services and Capital</p>
