**Abstract:** Many issues such as religion, beliefs, worldview are discussed in media. The pastors of the Church and all Christ's faithful – especially those who in any way take part in the management or use of the media – are to make an ample use of the means of social communication. Unfortunately, the media are place of many misuses and abuses. Sometimes those acts, because of being public, become canon offences. The public character means that the offence is committed at a public event or assembly, or in a published writing, or by otherwise using the means of social communication. The public offences are: blasphemy, harming public morals, affront for religion or the Church; disobedience of doctrinal matters; inciting hatred or animosity against the Apostolic See or the Ordinary or provoking disobedience against them; disseminating of course of the sacrament of penance and child pornography.
